MISS JULIE

by August Strindberg directed by Mark Lester

Written in 1888, Miss Julie caused outrage when it opened and was banned by the censors – yet over 130 years later, it's no surprise that this powerful drama still retains its shock factor.

It's Midsummer's Eve on a country estate and Miss Julie is ready to let her hair down while her father is away, and desperate to escape the responsibilities of being a Count's daughter. Fresh out of her engagement to a lawyer, a dance is just the remedy. Jean is the Count's valet and dreams of escaping the drudgery of a below-stairs existence. Despite his lack of formal education, Jean has travelled abroad, acquired languages, and has a wealth of work and life experience. He believes he's destined for bigger and better things, while Kristin, the cook and his fiancée, lovingly tolerates the working-class chip on Jean's shoulder and his disdain for the upper classes.

August Strindberg's *Miss* Julie was very much at the forefront of the naturalism movement in European theatre in the late 19th century, which not only sought more realistic performances, but writing that carefully studied human behaviour and put its underlying forces under the microscope. A scandal in its time, *Miss* Julie was undoubtedly effective in exposing the

harsher realities of life, yet to see it as no more than a battle of the sexes and class war, does the play a great disservice. It was ahead of its time in so many ways, exploring childhood trauma, mental health, the effects of class structure, faith, relationships and, most strikingly, female emancipation. These issues are just as relevant today as they were then, and it's for this that I think *Miss Julie's* popularity is unwavering, inspiring numerous productions on stage and screen, each bringing a fresh take on this well-known story.

When directing *Miss Julie*, the challenge was to ensure that such complex characters would come to life in a way that allowed their story to unfold naturally. Throughout the play, I think we root for Jean, Kristin and Julie at different times, often in different ways – they're provocative; each character appears both appealing and unlikeable, and our sympathies constant shift



between them until the play reaches its shocking conclusion. It's this ability to keep the audience on the edge of their seats, and the discussions I'm sure it will incite, which made me want to direct such a confronting play.

As always, our talented team of actors and backstage crew never cease to excite and amaze me. This year has robbed us all of so many of the things and people that are important to us; however, the passion, talent and commitment to the theatre burn as brightly as ever, and I am so grateful to everyone for their support and hard work.

On behalf of everyone involved, I hope you have as much fun watching *Miss Julie* as we've had creating the production. We hope you know how much we value your support to the NVT, and look forward to seeing you there!

Membership Update

It was way back in March 2020 that the advent of Covid forced us to suspend live theatre and to close our doors to our members. A decision was made then to freeze NVT membership but now with the virus hopefully in retreat we are looking forward to a time when we can once more have auditions, stage productions, hold live acting classes, and open the bar; all the things that make NVT what it is.

Membership will become active once more as from 1 September 2021 (some 18 months after it was suspended). For all of you who had an active membership in March 2020 the date of your membership renewal will be adjusted to compensate for the period of enforced closure. As an example; if you were due to renew in June 2020 you will now be asked to renew in December 2021.

All those whose membership had expired in the three months prior to March 2020 will be invited to renew their membership this September whilst the small number who did renew their

membership during the period of the freeze will have their renewal date put back to compensate for the 18-month period of closure; for example if membership was renewed in November 2020, then you would have been entitled to renew in May 2022 and having paid your subscription your next renewal will now be May 2023.

There were a number of people who joined the theatre during the period of closure and all these members will have their renewal date moved back to September 2022 as though they had become a member on 1 September 2021. Life members of course will see no change.

During the period of lockdown we have been looking at various software packages that could be used to automate our membership procedures and I am pleased to say that NVT has now acquired a software package developed by Membermojo, a firm based in Dorking. The software will be linked to the NVT website and will process new

applications and membership renewals. In future we will collect your name, email address and telephone contact only and there will be the opportunity for members to tell us which aspects of the theatre interest them (for example: acting, directing, set design) and the ways they would like to help support the activities of the theatre (for example: helping with publicity, the bar and front of house). As a member you will have online access to view and amend personal information and you will be able to print your own membership card.

Being a member of NTV provides you with access to a diverse range of theatrical experience but also gives you the opportunity to see our productions at a reduced cost. To enable the Box Office to operate the discount system and you to obtain the discount we need you to use your membership number when you book tickets. If you have forgotten your number you will be

able to find it by signing into the database.

Over the coming weeks members' details will be added to the new database and you will be invited to sign in to view your personal data and to complete the sections relating to your interests and the ways you would be willing to help support the work of the theatre. Access to the database is via the NVT webpage where you will identify yourself by your email address. You will have the option of setting a password if you wish to do so but it is not necessary. You will be sent an email reminding you when your new subscription is due with a link to the database where you can use PavPal to make your payment and at the same time update your personal data.


