# CONSENT


by Nina Raine directed by Scott Roberts

It's a real honour to be directing one of the first shows to welcome everyone back to the NVT after such a long hiatus. Anyone who was lucky enough to see *Di* and Viv and Rose will know that this season is already off to a flier. Congratulations to Claire and her team for a wonderfully successful production.

Having been one of the postponed productions from the 2019–2020 season, the original cast of *Consent* had already started rehearsals when the pandemic hit. But we're back now at last, and after some necessary re-casting we're finally getting a chance to show you this fantastic play.

*Consent* is a modern classic, written in 2017 and described by Michael Billington as "a play of fierce moral intelligence". It was pre-emptively topical, debuting at the National Theatre a few

months before the #MeToo movement erupted.

At first reading I loved Nina Raine's energetic text full of dark, unapologetic humour. You question yourself for finding it funny. During rehearsals, I'm constantly laughing with my hand over my mouth. It was also refreshing to read so many well written, female roles.

In the play, Raine attacks the legal system and highlights its failure to bring justice

to the victims it was designed to protect. Barristers joke with little empathy about their cases, whilst their own personal lives are disintegrating. Their living rooms become the courtroom.

Each character in *Consent* is at their most raw. Their vivid emotions provoke difficult

conversations. The play asks you more questions than it answers. This is a messy, confusing and uncomfortable realism, all of which the actors and myself adore discussing and exploring. I should also warn you that the themes are powerful and emotional, some of which you may find upsetting. We do. But we also feel that this is no reason to avoid *Consent*.

The cast are all amazing. Firstly, we have a couple of familiar faces; Victoria Storm (playing Kitty) and Nik Balfe (Tim) return after their recent electric performances in *Miss Julie*. Some of you may also be familiar with Maya Katherine (Gayle), who last trod the boards here when she was a student within the New Venture Youth Theatre Group.

As well as these three wonderful actors, I feel very privileged to introduce you to five brand new NVT members – Will Mytum (Ed), Aoife Bradley (Rachel), Brad Glen (Jake), Karina Mills (Zara)

and Erin McHugh (Laura). I have no doubt that they'll all knock your socks off. Their commitment and dedication to this production has been more than I could ever hope for. Entertainment was provided in the beautifully lit Studio by the fab-





ulous LaLa Band from London (David Roper, Lynn Sutcliffe and Shamil Sharshek) and our equally talented NVT singers (Jack Lynn, Aaron Coomer, Helen Betty Ann, Tom Slater-Hydman, Tristan Wolfe, Fintan Shevlin). With sequins sparkling and feather boas flying, they performed three sets of feel-good songs, from show tunes to Abba to German leider. Between the sets, there were refreshments to be had and raffle tickets to be bought, and the prize draw took place without a single fix!

It proved a hugely popular event, and putting it together truly was a team effort. Gerry and I would like to thank Tom Slater-Hyndman, Carol Croft, Naomi Horsfall, Strat Mastoris, Peter Meekings, Carrie Hynds

## **DI** AND **VIV** AND **ROSE**

#### **REVIEW 1**

First produced at the Hampstead Theatre in 2012, *Di and Viv and Rose* tells the story of three University friends and the development of their relationships from the first days of their living together in 1983 through to 2010.

In the wrong hands, this production could so easily have sunk into stereotypical interpretation. The bubbly, middleclass, Rose; the angry feminist, Viv, and the sporty lesbian, Di, are clear character traps for lazy actors and unimaginative directors. Within minutes, however, we knew that we were very definitely in the right hands.

The show's pace and the skill and subtlety brought to their characterisation by Sophie Dearlove (Di), Emmie Spencer (Viv) and Mandy Jane Jackson (Rose) clearly demonstrated the care and deep understanding they and director, Claire Lewis, had so obviously invested in creating beautifully layered personalities, rich with vulnerabilities and strengths.

They gave us moments of hilarity such as Di's terrible awkwardness as she appeared in the outfit her mother had bought her for Freshers' Week. They gave us rage and despair. They gave us the love and tenderness they felt for each other as when Rose fed soup to the traumatised Di. They gave us the un-

cluttered joy of being young and being together as they danced to Prince's 'Let's Go Crazy'. None of it overplayed. None of it self-conscious. Three actors totally immersed in the moment.

And in just under two hours, they created for us a sense of the passing of almost thirty years. The audience was helped to recognise this transition with a montage of projected news images. In so doing, we

were cleverly 'included' as it enabled a resonance with our own stories. It was the actors' subtle changes of vocal tone and physicality that gave us a sense of the impact upon them of their passing years. The successful creation of that arc is testament to the skill and thoughtful direction – that 'big picture' perspective –


that Claire Lewis demonstrates.

The very best of theatre gently and often without us even realising it, leads us to turn and look at our own lives and usually at the level of feeling rather than with words. This was the very best of theatre.

There was a confident exuberance to Sophie Dearlove, Emmie Spencer and Mandy-Jane Jackson's performances as the eponymous

Di, Viv and Rose respectively: three disparate women thrown together, learning to become mates. Each captured the individual essence of her character – Viv who filters life through her Sociology studies, but is emotionally closed, Rose, lighter on intellect, brazenly plunging into a pool of men, and Di exploring her sexuality. Director, Claire Lewis had teased-out from her actors a true bond.

Amelia Bullmore does not choose to write an easy path, introducing rape to what could have been a 'Liver Birds'-type comedy, killing off Rose (the dynamo of the trio) and then exploring the uncomfortable gap that it leaves between Di and Viv. As the play introduces these heavier subjects, the structure fractures, increasing the demands on director, actors and staging to make smaller, sometimes snatched, scenes still resonate. Mostly the production succeeded with this more challenging second half.

Scene changes were slickly handled by la the actors themselves (perhaps some



could have been a little quicker if they had involved stage management as well). The production was a little too forward-facing, not always succeeding in including audience members seated at the far ends. The sound design and video montages were impressive and essential to the timetravelling of the play. The lighting was warm and moody with effective 'time' flashes. If the all-black set seemed a little austere for the student flat (even if dressed with posters and postcards), stripped it allowed the space to be a railway station, a funeral chapel, a New York apartment.

This was a strong opening production for the NVT 2021/22 season. Together, Claire, her cast and crew created something rather special. And the most haunting moment was perhaps also the simplest – the arresting image of the three women huddled close on their 'den' mattress.

The person undertaking this role should be a Personal License holder or be willing to obtain one, and bar experience would be an advantage.

#### SOCIAL MEDIA COORDINATOR

Provide media support to the theatre through Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, etc to inform the public on productions and other items of interest promoting the theatre. This role will involve interaction and coordination with other volunteers such as the Artistic Director, Publicity & Marketing Coordinator and Volunteer Coordinator.

#### HEALTH AND SAFETY ASSISTANT

Assist the Chairman with overall health and safety activities, including H&S risks in productions.

#### COMPANY STAGE MANAGER

Help deliver a successful season of plays by overseeing the backstage and technical work of the Theatre. Including coordination of other members/actors and set design & construction, lighting, sound, props, wardrobe and stage management.
