

Communicating Doors has been a fun and somewhat challenging play to direct. It was written in 1994, but starts in a futuristic 2014, where armed uprisings in London are a backdrop to the society of the time. However, they do not have any significant influence in the play.

The play is set in a 6th floor suite in the Regal Hotel in London and evolves around the communicating door, which leads to a cupboard. However, for some characters it leads into the suite they came from, but at a different time.

Poopay, a sexual specialist consultant, arrives at the hotel suite for an appointment. This is no ordinary booking and one that will change her life and that of others who have previously died 'accidentally'.

I hope you enjoy this play as much as we have enjoyed rehearsing and developing it. A challenge in many ways.


