TURPIN

Richard Turpin: son of a butcher, and a man with the possibility of a career and a reasonable life. The legendary highwayman had choices, and yet he chose the open road and a life of crime. Since then, many have continued to be fascinated by the man behind the mask and a brace of flintlocks. And not just Turpin, but other charismatic gangsters and villains that followed him — somehow, we're ready to overlock the fact that criminals like Dick are prepared to go to any lengths to get what they want.

Largely set in the highwayman's condemned cell in York, Turpin explores his life through a series of flashbacks. We meet a variety of characters along the way, including his best friend Tom King and other criminal associates, "onlookers, well-wishers and gawpers" to his confinement, and the priest trying to save Dick's soul.

Barry Purchese's fantastic reputation as a writer is unquestioned, and when he approached me to direct Turpin, I was both delighted and nervous. As a play, Turpin makes an interesting read, with its great attention to detail and extensive research into Dick's life evident throughout. However, when placed in the hands of an extremely talented cast, the real quality of the writing shines through, as the story lifts from the page and the characters come to life. We get the reason why we go to the theatre: a drama. We get an incredible story that is in turn funny, moving, frightening and thought-provoking. A story where sometimes life is stranger than fiction.

It's not just in the writing where I've been lucky — I'm profoundly blessed to have assembled a fantastic cast, with each member contributing their creative talent to the work with absolute commitment and energy. As ever, the team behind the scenes are the unsung heroes, without whom I'd be unable to do my job. I'm proud of every single one of the cast and crew, and my sincerest gratifude goes to them, and to Barry for inviting me to direct this amazing piece.

On behalf of everyone involved, thank you for your continued support of the NVT, we're immensely grateful and hope that Turpin will give you plenty to talk about in the bar afterwards!




Mickey Knighton - Tom King

Jerry is an actor and director. He has acted and directed for the NVT, and a number of companies over the years, gaining a couple of awards along the way. Next season, he's directing 'Not Talking' by Mike Bartlett.


Thomas Dee - Jack/Tailor



Hopefully you are aware that we are trying to raise money to carry out some important renovations and improvements to our wonderful Grade II listed theatre. Although recent relaxations in the COVID rules mean we can now put on shows again, the pendemic has already reduced our anticipated income for 2021/22. Additionally we have recently discovered significant repairs are needed to the large windows on south side of the building. The need to raise funds is therefore even more important as the Committee
