# **Farragut North**

Farragut North takes place during the political campaign of a fast-rising, insurgent US presidential candidate during a tight primary race. The main protagonist of the play is Stephen Bellamy, the young, brilliant, ruthlessly ambitious press secretary for the candidate who is confident he can steer the campaign team into the White House.

#### Act 1

Scene 1: January. Evening. The bar of the Hotel Fort Des Moines, Des Moines, Iowa.
Scene 2: Later that evening at a small restaurant in East Des Moines.
Scene 3: Early the next morning in Stephen's hotel room at the Hotel Fort Des Moines.
Scene 4: Later that morning, Des Moines airport.

#### Act 2

Scene 1: Later that afternoon at a campaign event in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

Scene 2: A few hours later, Molly's office at the campaign headquarters in Des Moines.

Scene 3: Later that evening, Paul's room at the Hotel Fort Des Moines.

Scene 4: An hour later at the same restaurant as Act One.

Scene 5: Late that night, Stephen's hotel room.

The production runs approximately 2 hours, including a fifteen minute intermission.

# Will Mytum (Stephen Bellamy)

Will trained at East 15. This is his third production at the NVT, following Consent and The York Realist. Professional credits include The Railway Children at York Royal Theatre, Bottleneck at the Old Red Lion, Jumpers for Goalposts at Oldham Coliseum, Bitesize Chekhov at Edinburgh Fringe and National Tour and FCUK'd at the Bunker Theatre, for which he was nominated for Best Actor at the Off-West End Awards. Will is the producer of We Are Animate Theatre Company and General Manager at BOAT.



# Bridgett Ane Lawrence (Ida)

Bridgett Ane began her career at Chicago's Orchestra Hall and Goodman Theatre before moving to New York where she worked in both film and off-Broadway while singing in a rock band. She toured the US with contemporary dance company Mandalas. After moving to London, she premiered her first feature film, Honeymooner. She is currently the lead singer Atlantic Crossing and teaches yoga at her school in Brighton, Yoga in the Lanes. Her most recent stage appearance was as Ariel in Brighton Little Theatre's The Tempest. Previous work at the NVT includes as Ruth in Harold Pinter's The Homecoming.



# Mark Lester (Paul Zara)

Mark is a trained actor, director and a member of NVT's Artistic Director team. He has appeared in a number of NVT productions including *The Lieutenant of Inishmore*, and recently directed *Turpin*.



## Alec Watson (Ben)

Alec recently graduated from the University of Oxford where he performed in various plays and films. He was a member of the National Youth Theatre and played Romeo in 60 Hour Shakespeare's production of Romeo and Juliet in Reading. This summer, he wrote for and performed in two comedy shows as a member of The Oxford Revue, as well as appearing in Quartet by Sam Spencer. His most recent role was as Toby in The Effect by Lucy Prebble at the King's Head in Islington and the Old Fire Station in Oxford. This production marks his first appearance at the NVT.

Melissa Paris (Molly)

Melissa previously appeared at the NVT playing W in Cock by Mike Barlett as part of the Brighton Fringe. Most recently she played Revion in The Revion Girl at Brighton Little Theatre. Past credits include as Desdemona in Othello at Finsbury Park and Hermione in The Winter's Tale at Ealing Studio.



Jim Calderwood (Tom Duffy)

Jim returns to the NVT having first appeared there 28 years ago. Recent performances include in *Old Times* by Harold Pinter and as Claudius in *Hamlet*. Other recent theatre includes *Invisible Sentence* for Uninterrupted Theatre Company at the Old Market and the acclaimed *Operation Black Antler* with Hydrocracker Theatre Company for the Brighton Festival.



Spencer Banks (Waiter)

Spencer began his professional career at the age of 14. Television credits include as Ryan Harper in Night and Day, Liam Collinson in Girls in Love and Toby Crawford in The Bill for ITV. He has extensively toured his comedy sketch show Willie & Fanny. In 2016 his pilot The Downs was commissioned and filmed by Lime Pictures. More recently he appeared in the films The Beast of Bevendean and High Water. His previous appearance at the NVT was as Gobbel in The Lying Kind. He also works as a voice actor and audiobook narrator.
