# PYRENEES by David Greig

David Greig is relatively unknown outside his native Scotland, even though many of his plays have been performed internationally and in London's West End. His work has been commissioned by the RSC and Paines Plough, amongst others, and Pyrenees was commissioned as part of Paines Plough's This Other England season in 2005.

The play explores themes of national and personal identity, otherness and strangerhood. Greig's recurrent fascination with these themes reflects his personal history: he was born in Scotland, raised in Nigeria, educated in an American Baptist school, and is now living in Scotland. He says: "I have a powerful compulsive desire to be rooted and a powerful awareness that I'm not. It's the tension between those two things that produce quite a lot of the material in my work."

I was first drawn to Pyrenees by its lyricism and playful use of language. The piece simultaneously celebrates language and highlights it's limitations: the Man's experience in the snow is a place that language cannot grasp, a place beyond the everyday, a no-place...

The cast have spent many hours with me wrestling with this multi-layered piece which is open to many interpretations, and throws up more questions than it answers.

I feel very fortunate to work with such a creative and hard working cast, crew and production team and I can't thank them enough for bringing this project to fruition.

Finally, a big thanks to Katie Brownings for suggesting I put in a proposal to direct a show at the NVT and for her help and support as Production Manager on the show.

I hope you have fun going on this journey with us!

Swinging from researcher on Arts Documentaries at the BBC in London to Production assistant on music videos in Rome; from editing photo essays with Magnum Photographers in New York to creating online fashion and beauty content for ELLE Magazine in London; back to New York to pursue life as an artist (aka working in a bar and as a PA for a photographer/filmmaker) then finding herself in Brighton just in time for Covid and finally making the realisation that actually, yes, she is an actor. Since completing some more training at ACT, Brighton, Tia has enjoyed playing a diverse range of roles including Caesar's wife, an AI, and an alcoholic ghost. She has also written a short play and is in the process of writing a one-person show.





**SAMANTHA FERREE:** Sam's theatre work began with the title role of *Electra* in Sophocles Electra at Group 64 Youth Theatre in Putney. After training at Arts Ed, she worked in young peoples theatre on tours with Theatre Centre, The Orange Tree, Tie Break and LPC in Germany and ETC in Spain. She worked as a traffic and travel radio presenter for Metro Networks and now continues to do voice work for IVR phone systems for British Airways, HMRC, Santander and Vodaphone. Sam gained an MA in Voice Studies from Central School of Speech and Drama in 2006 and taught voice at Italia Conti, ALRA and London Centre for Theatre Studies. She is now a freelance voice and communication coach, specialising in vocal delivery, confidence and presentation skills. This is her first production with NVT and very happy to be performing again after a long break!

**SIMON HUDSON:** Simon was a professional actor between 1987 and 2000, after graduating from Hull University and The Webber Douglas Academy. He worked extensively in repertory at The Leicester Haymarket, Manchester Royal Exchange, Birmingham, Nottingham Playhouse, Harrogate and Bolton Reps. He was in a C4 soap for a good while, as well as performing in a host of premieres on the London Fringe at venues such as The Bush, The Old Red Lion, The Etcetera and The Finborough Arms. Since 2000 he has been a Drama and English teacher but has continued to be involved in theatre. He directed, devised and produced 'Hurricane Michael,' a sell-out comedy about Mr Phish and the storm of 89, which toured the country and The Edinburgh and Brighton Festivals between 2015 and 2018. Previous shows at The NVT include Roland in 'Jumpy' and Michael in 'Happy Now' in 2018.



**SANDIE ARMSTRONG (Director):** Sandie is very excited to be directing at the NVT for the first time. Previously she directed another David Greig play, Brewers Fayre, for the Brighton Fringe, to critical and audience acclaim. 
