Suddenly Last Summer

Better known for his major plays A Streetcar Named Desire, Cat on a Hot Tin Roof and The Glass Menagerie, Tennessee Williams finds perhaps greater subtle and poetic depth in his 1957 masterpiece Suddenly Last Summer.

At the core of Suddenly Last Summer is a battle of destruction and survival between Mrs Venable and Catherine Holly: one determined to defend the prized, golden image of her beloved son at all costs, the other fighting desperately to bring the truth to light and to protect her sanity.

Arguably, Williams is one of the best writers of female roles, able to reach into the core and bring out the deepest emotions of his conflicted characters. His world is one in which love is distorted - a mother's love of her son, a niece's love of her cousin - yet he is a champion of those who suffer distortion and repression, sexual and social, and he invites the audience in to experience each character's desperation. Williams' dialogue attains a level of dramatic eloquence that few other playwrights of the time were able to reach. He was a brave, outspoken man who lived in dangerous times for men who were hiding their sexuality.

Williams was also not afraid to embrace the surreal in set, sound and lighting design, innovating a form that brought in fresh elements, and creating a space for a new and invigorating expressionistic theatre.

As a director, I've been a huge admirer of his work and drawn to it many times. Williams' work is exciting to explore, and he remarked that Suddenly Last Summer was his most poetic work. To work with a fine cast and company is a privilege, to enable the emergence of the characters from the text and to bring the issues to life.


