



# An Experiment with an Airpump

"Is Progress an Illusion and the Past a Myth?"

Inspired by Joseph Wright's painting "An Experiment on a Bird in the Air Pump", Shelagh Stephenson's ambitious play invites the audience into a world where the old collides with the new.

One grand house in Newcastle is occupied by two families each teetering on the edge of change:

1799: It is the eve of a new century; the age of enlightenment - when science promises to dissipate the darkness of superstition and ignorance. The house buzzes with scientific experiments, furtive romance and farcical amateur dramatics.

1999: A world of technology, genetic engineering and changed societal roles that would once have been unimaginable; yet ethical dilemmas and irrationality persist. As a new millennium dawns, the cellar reveals a dark secret buried for 200 years.

As we travel back and forth, the two tales are linked by a common thread: what moral price are we willing to pay for scientific advancement?

Shelagh Stephenson is an English playwright and actress born in Tynemouth. Her other stage plays include The Memory of Water and Five Kinds of Silence.

The talented cast will take you on a roller coaster ride across two centuries on a quest for knowledge and progress, with a plot full of twists, gender role reversals and a little magic. With live music by Steve Hoar.

Directed by award-winner Sam Chittenden (Brighton Fringe Outstanding Show, 2021). This will be Sam's sixth full length production at New Venture. Previous shows include The Arsonists, The Clean House, Antigone, The Language Archive and a double bill of Unsanctioned / Measure 2 Measure.

Steve Hoar: Musical Director & Piano

Steve first worked as Musical Director and composer on A Christmas Carol in 2015. Since then, he has worked on Dick Barton, Blood Wedding and previously collaborated with Sam Chittenden on The Clean House, all at the NVT. He also worked with Slurring Words Theatre on The Pillowman and A Midsummer Night's Dream.

Steve works as a piano tutor and sings with Brighton Voices. He enjoys composing original soundtracks for theatre. He's also a friend of The Brighton Philharmonic and encourages you to support your local orchestra!

#### Bertie Purchese: Violin

Bertie was in the Brighton Youth Orchestra growing up and studied music at A-level, but left violin behind shortly after. He wouldn't return to it until nearly 15 years later when he - coincidentally landed his first acting role at NVT: A Christmas Carol in 2015. Since then, Bertie has appeared in a number of productions as an actor and on occasion, has played violin in them. 'Air Pump' musical director Steve Hoar was musical director of A Christmas Carol all those years ago, and Bertie is appropriately pumped to be working with him again.





#### Juliet Rowley: Viola

Juliet is a multi-instrumentalist, playing the oboe and the viola. She has extensive experience playing in orchestras and smaller ensembles, and most recently was a member of Sutton Symphony Orchestra prior to moving to Brighton. She played the oboe in an adaptation of *A Midsummer Night's Dream* by Slurring Words Theatre at Stanmer House grounds in 2018, working with Steve Hoar in his capacity of Musical Director. Juliet balances her digital desk job by walking on the South Downs. She is also a keen photographer, enjoys baking but is a terrible cake decorator!
