# Les Liaisons Dangereuses

A plot hatched by Madame de Merteuil is one fueled by a desire to not only avenge an infidelity of an ex-lover, but also over the person closest to her. Valmont agrees to assist his ex-lover to take his own revenge on Merteuil's cousin who has dared to interfere in his pursuit of Madame de Tourvel; Cecile, Volange's beautiful young daughter and Merteuil's niece, is a hapless pawn in the pair's vicious game. "Love is something you use, not something you fall into, like quicksand, don't you remember?" asks Merteuil. And this attitude is what sees the fallout devastate so many in the play.

People frequently ask what it is that makes you choose a play you want to direct, and for me personally, it varies. Essentially though, it is the story and the challenges it presents to me, the actors, and subsequently the audience. Are the audience going to connect with the plot? Are they going to care about the characters? Is it going to resonate with them on some levels?

Choosing the wrong partner, a mother with a problematic teenage daughter who she does not know what to do with, love, sex, jealousy, societal pressures, exploitation, betrayal, and all against the backdrop of a country that seems on the brink of turmoil because of the burgeoning gap between rich and poor. It is safe to say the play's issues are still highly relevant today.

Apart from being an incredible piece of writing for the theatre, the personal driving force is to create a piece of theatre that takes the audience on a journey with each of the play's protagonists. Lee Strasberg, the eminent theatre practitioner who developed Stanislavski's 'Method', said that "acting is being private in public." This has stuck with me both as an actor and director. There should be times at which the audience should almost feel like they are voyeurs, watching intensely personal moments they feel they ought not to be, while being fascinated and drawn in by them. The play is wry, witty, sexy, shocking, and moving in equal measure.

At NVT, I have been lucky enough to have had the support of our incredible Artistic Director, as well as having a fantastic cast, crew, and design teams who have worked tirelessly to help make this production everything I had hoped it could be.

Finally, I would like to dedicate the production to the memory of Simon Goodenough and Timothy Lawrence. I never had the privilege of meeting either man, but their warm, creative, and talented daughters do them both extremely proud.


# King Lear by William Shakespeare
