THE SWEET SCIENCE OF BRUISING

1869, Islington. Four Victorian women are drawn into London's underground world of exhibition pugilism: Violet Hunter, a nurse with ambitions of becoming a doctor; Anna Lamb, an abused wife and mother for whom boxing is a way to fight back; Matilda Blackwell, who finds flashing her fists more satisfying than flashing her ankles when times are hard; and Polly Stokes, a pit brow lass who dreams of becoming a prize fighter. Each woman enters the ring under the instruction of 'Professor' Charlie Sharp, fighting against the expectations of the men around them, for the title of 'Lady Boxing Champion of the World'.

Little is known of the early history of women's boxing in the UK. While the 18th century often celebrated women prize fighters, the 19th century didn't. Recent research from University of Southampton found that between 1850-1900 over 162 prize fights involving women took place, but concerns about the more visible role of women in society, women's rights and public order, meant that many more went unreported.

Joy Wilkinson's thought-provoking play is one of contrasts. It encounters the harsh realities of an era defined by scientific advancement but stricken by poverty, of social morality versus hypocrisy, and social order versus self-fulfillment. It imagines what its heroines' lives could be, and considers what risks they would take, if given the opportunity to fight for a better future.

At its heart is the importance of power and of passion in each character's pursuit of self-realisation, whether at home, work, or in the ring. It's as timely as ever.

Collaborating on this piece has been an amazing experience. We're immensely thankful for the creativity, commitment and enthusiasm of our brilliant production team, and especially of our talented cast, the hardest-working actors around. They have each embraced the play's challenges with dedication and determination. A special mention must go to Chris, George and Sam from Noble Science of Defence for their patience, humour, and inexhaustible support of the cast during their boxing and fencing training – the result is a thrill to watch!
