## Taking Care of Baby

I first encountered this play when helping a student select an appropriate monologue for a drama school audition. She had left it very late to choose one and I was hoping that a solution would present itself - I hope it did the trick. Reading it for myself, I was soon transported into the complicated, dark, troubled world of Donna and the characters she shares the stage with.

I thought immediately that the studio space was the perfect forum to present this story, implying, as it does the involvement of the audience in the action.

It has been a hugely rewarding, challenging and informative experience working with such an experienced and gifted cast who have, from the first moment, thrown themselves wholly into exploring both the complex array of themes, but also, ways in which the story can be told in a bold and imaginative manner.

I would like to acknowledge all the wonderful support I have had from many members of the NVT both formally and informally. Rod Lewis has been a hugely illuminating source of theatrical knowledge over my two years as a member and I have been privileged to share conversations over a cup of coffee at his favourite café in Hove Street. Charly Sommers was a huge help in scheduling the first phase of rehearsal which is a complicated and time-consuming job which was far more challenging than I could have guessed at the outset.. Lastly, I would like to thank my mentor Mark Wilson who has always had the best interests of the show at heart and always demanded the highest standards which are the hallmark of NVT productions.

### Mr Kelly - Spike Padley


