Director's Notes

Rules for Living by Sam Holcroft is a brilliantly chaotic and darkly comedic examination of family dysfunction and the unspoken behavioural "rules" we follow to cope with stress, especially within the family sphere. Set around a Christmas dinner gathering that spins hilariously out of control, Holcroft's play deftly combines biting satire with physical farce, taking the audience on a rollercoaster of laughter and discomfort.

The central conceit of the play to me is ingenious: each character operates under specific rules dictating their behaviour. These rules, revealed to the audience and eventually layered with new rules as tensions rise, create a unique theatrical experience. Watching the characters attempt to maintain their composure while abiding by these absurd rules adds a distinct layer of physical comedy and a sense of escalating absurdity.

Holcroft's writing is sharp, capturing the painful irony of holiday gatherings where every word and action is carefully chosen—until it's not, and everything implodes. The play serves as both a cautionary tale and an invitation to consider how these "rules for living" hold us back from authentic connection and true expression.

It has certainly been a challenging production to stage and I am incredibly grateful to our brilliant, patient cast and backstage team who have all been essential in the realising of this Yuletide treat.

The Incident Room by Olivia Hurst & David Byrne directed by Richard Lindfield


