Auto-Da-Fe by Tennessee Williams directed by Ayshen Irfan

Auto-da-Fé is an intense and haunting exploration of repression, desire, and psychological torment. Set in 1940s New Orleans, the play follows Eloi, a sexually repressed postal worker who lives under the watchful eye of his overbearing mother. Haunted by his own desires and consumed by guilt, he perceives the city as a den of corruption and sin. Desperate for purity, he spirals toward a tragic and fiery resolution.

Patti Griffiths - Mme. Duvenet (Auto-Da-Fe)

Over the years, Patti has morphed from daughter roles via mother roles to grandmother roles, but is overjoyed to be able to turn the clocks back in 'Auto-da-Fe' and play Eloi's (Bertie's) mother in this, her NVT debut. She has really enjoyed working with Ayshen and the rest of the NVT team and hopes you will enjoy this little gem of a play as much as she has.





Bertie Purchese - Eloi (Auto-Da-Fe)

Bertie has been performing at NVT since 2015, and has appeared in numerous shows, including 'Pickwick and Weller', 'Happy Now', 'Lovesong', 'The Messiah', 'Proof', and more. You might also have spotted him in last year's 'Les Liaisons Dangereuse' and as a musician in 'An Experiment with an Air Pump'. Bertie appeared earlier this year in the BHOS musical production of 'Company', and has performed with Patti Griffiths once before in Brighton Little Theatre's 'Dark Sublime'.

Ayshen Irfan - Director (Auto-Da-Fe)

This production marks Ayshen's directorial debut, having first found her footing in theatre through a Tennessee Williams play... an experience that sparked both admiration and ambition. It feels fitting that her first production pays quiet homage to that beginning. Prior to this, Ayshen worked behind the scenes as a stage manager, where she developed a deep respect for the craft. Ayshen is grateful to be working with such a sharp, spirited cast, whose wit and commitment give her full confidence in bringing Williams' short play to life.





Justine Smith - The Stage Manager (Fade to Black)

Justine has been acting for 10 years. Her performances include Rosie Probert, 'Under Milk Wood'; Miss Haversham, 'Great Expectations'; Mrs Saunders and Gerry, 'Cloud Nine'; Aunt Juliana, 'Hedda Gabler'; Alta, 'Language Archives'; Oberon, 'Revenge of the Amazons'; May Day, Murder at the Manor and Penny in Brighton Festival Operation 'Black Antler'. Most recently at NVT she appeared as Loud Woman and Tea Woman in 'Mixie' and as Brigida in 'Heresy of Love'. In this short play season, Justine plays the Stage Manager in 'Fade to Black', not to be confused with God!

Mike Everett - Bob Crump (Fade to Black)

This is Mike's first time performing with the NVT, and he's excited to continue developing as an aspiring stage actor. With a background in design, music and writing, he's passionate about creative storytelling and exploring character. Taking on the role of Bob Crump, a young, arrogant businessman whose untimely demise forces him to confront the truth about existence, has been an intense, challenging and rewarding experience.



Clare Pearl Lyons - Minion (Fade to Black)



Clare completed a BA in Drama, studied acting at City Lit (London) and has deepened her practice with Meisner technique and Improv. She performed in a production of Alan Ayckbourn's 'Seasons Greetings' with City Lit Rep. She was mentored by burlesque performer Rubyyy Jones, and devised and performed a neoburlesque show at Courtyard Theatre, London. Clare has performed in puppetry shows with Puppet Grinder Cabaret at Passing Clouds and Rich Mix (London). She is currently obsessed with Clown and accessing joy through grotesque silliness.

Ruper Johnson - Minion (Fade to Black)

Rupert Johnson lives in Brighton and works around the world mainly hosting movement, breathwork and bodywork training courses / retreats. He runs Sweatlodges in Stanmer Park, Brighton and enjoys making music and theatre as hobbies.

The words spoken at the start of 'Fade to Black' are adapted from a talk given by Ram Dass, an American spiritual teacher, in the 1970s.







In the last couple of years, Greg has enjoyed working at the NVT and is excited to be stepping back into the directing role.

Persephone is an artist and producer who believes in the use of creativity to approach big questions. Collaboration and accessibility are at the heart of their practice. 

George - Ben Pritchard (Red Peppers)






