As the director of this production, I am thrilled to bring Sea Wall to life in our space. This play is a masterclass in storytelling—raw, poetic, and profoundly human. It explores themes of love, loss, and the fragility of existence through the eyes of Alex, a photographer whose life is irrevocably changed by a single moment. Jon Cottrell brings a fresh and deeply moving interpretation to the role of Alex. Watching Jon inhabit this character has been a privilege, and I believe audiences will be captivated by his ability to connect so viscerally with the material. Our staging is deliberately minimal and stripped back, allowing the words and performance to take centre stage. The intimacy of New Venture Theatre studio offers the perfect setting for this one-man play, drawing the audience into Alex's world and holding them there with quiet intensity.

Sea Wall is not just a play—it's an emotional journey. Whether you're a seasoned theatre-goer or new to the stage, this production promises to be a memorable and thought-provoking experience.

W.M.D. Woman of Mass Deception

I grew up (as many of us did) on Homer's classic story of the Trojan War - the seduction of Helen and the great Greek expedition to get her back and to punish Troy. But when I looked at maps to find out where Troy actually was - right at the mouth of the narrow channel linking the Mediterranean to the Black Sea - what jumped out was just how incredibly strategic the location is. The Trojans would have been able to control and tax all the goods passing their city. And to raise those tariffs to punitive levels, if they chose - rather like President Trump is doing these days. So I wrote a Bronze Age story, which turns out to be right up to date. And more. Politically, the Greeks would have needed an excuse to attack Troy. Why not set up Helen as a 'honey-trap', so that it was actually she who seduced the Trojan prince Paris, and not vice-versa? Helen of Troy as a Woman of Mass Deception - W.M.D.

But W.M.D. also refers to the illusory 'Weapons of Mass Destruction' that served as an excuse for Tony Blair and George Bush to attack Saddam Hussein's Iraq in 2003. Nothing much changes in politics in three and a half thousand years ...

I feel incredibly privileged to have a hugely talented cast of five actors to bring this play to life.

Mark Lester as King Agamemnon, Jo Salter as his daughter Iphigenia, Kasha Goodenough as Helen, Jeremy
Crow as the Treasurer of Mycenae, and Rich Watkins (in his first NVT role) as the wily Odysseus / Tony Blair.


Mark Lester - Agamemnon

Rich Watkins - Odysseus & Tony Blair





Kill Local is a dark comedy about Sheila, a disillusioned assassin who has lost her passion for murder. Raised in a family of contract killers, Sheila once took pride in her work—but now, her growing conscience and professional mistakes threaten not just her livelihood, but her life. As Sheila grapples with the morality of her profession and the weight of familial loyalty, she is forced to confront the line between justice and revenge. Kill Local explores what happens when killing becomes just another job—and quitting isn't an option.

Pickwick and Weller by Barry Purchese directed by Rod Lewis Samuel Pickwick is a warm-hearted and well-meaning man of advancing years, but, despite his age, still something of an innocent. As he sets forth on his adventures into the wider world, he is easy pickings for rogues such as Alfred Jingle and the rascally lawyers Dodson and Fogg. He is in need of a protector, and no-one comes better qualified than the streetwise Sam Weller. Sam, with his singular brand of philosophy, never fails to make us laugh as he comes to the rescue of Pickwick time and again. Mr Pickwick, Sam and Tony Weller, Alfred Jingle, Tupman, Snodgrass, Winkle, Dodson and Fogg, Dr Slammer, Mrs Bardell... these are just a few of the kaleidoscope of comic characters who come together in a Dickensian romp that gives us a perception of the human condition that is both insightful and extremely funny.

4000 Days by Peter Quilter directed by Charly Sommers Michael wakes from a three-week coma to find two people at his side: his sharp-tongued mother, Carol, and his devoted partner of ten years, Paul. Carol and Paul are united in two things: their dedication to Michael, and their loathing of one another. They soon discover Michael remembers nothing of the last 4000 days — and therefore, nothing of Paul. Paul must now fight to bring Michael's memory back while Carol's on a mission to remove him from their lives completely. While grappling with his fractured identity, Michael begins painting a vibrant mural across his hospital room wall — a vivid expression of grief, longing, and the search for the man he used to be... not the stranger he's become..
